1 Apologies

Apologies were received from Cllr J Bell

2 Minutes of the previous meeting

The minutes of the previous meeting held on 2 March 2020 were agreed as true record.

3 Oracle Update

K Lazzari gave an update on the performance of Oracle. The teams at DCC and CDDFRS (ICT DEBS and Oracle) had been working together in relation to accessibility of the DCC systems. Significant progress had been made.

4 Presentation – iPad, Benefits and Future Opportunities

Mark Henderson joined the meeting and gave a detailed presentation on the iPad functions including:

- What does the service want to achieve?
- Improved efficiency and accuracy
- Compliance with data protection and GDPR
- How the service has achieved this

Cllr Stoker commented on the ease of use of Apple products and discussion followed on the importance of security that the service had.

Cllr Lee queried who had access to the tablets. The Community Risk Safety Team and crews had access. All had received training.

5 Performance Report Quarter One 2020/21

The organisational performance indicators for quarter one of the 2020/21 financial year were presented to the committee by K Wanley.

The committee discussed the indicators in turn noting were performance was strong or where additional work was required to secure improvement. Overall 70% of the strategic PIs met or exceeded their target level.

Cllr Carr queried the business fire safety audits and the effect of Covid-19. K Wanley noted that the majority of audits are carried out by operational crews but during lockdown desk top audits had been undertaken.

Cllr Lee queried the fires that had taken place in the Midgrige ward. K Wanley noted that these had been secondary fires and the central arson reduction team had been speaking with young people in the area to make them aware of the consequences of arson.

Cllr Lee queried the statistics in the report don't seem to alter substantially. S Helps noted that data for analysis purposes is looked at over a period of years not just quarterly.

The committee **<u>noted</u>** the report.

6 Sickness Absence Performance

S Nattrass gave an update on the sickness absence performance for the periods 1 April 2019 – 31 March 2020 and 1 April 2020 – 30 June 2020 and sickness for each staff group was discussed and in relation to Covid-19.
