revenue and capital budgets and medium-term financial plan (MTFP) to agree a firm recommendation on the budget and council tax to the meeting of the Fire Authority on 19 February 2021.

Members discussed the council tax increase and noted the reason for 1.96% increase rather than 1.99% as this figure keeps all council tax bands below 2%

Pay awards were discussed and it was noted that funding for any pay awards would have to be met by the service.
