HOW WE REDUCE STATION RISKS

VERY HIGH

11

- Target and deliver quality Safe & Wellbeing visits to the most vulnerable in the community, focussing on making referrals to partners.
- Develop & apply a consistent menu of tactics with partners to reduce deliberate car fires and secondary (nuisance) fires.
- Promote and develop FireStoppers internally, and within the community.
- Conduct joint fire investigations with Police to identify trends & prosecute offenders.

HIGH

- Complete business fire safety audits, familiarisation visits and where appropriate pursue enforcement. (Conducted by FS team)
- Gather new & reinspect existing operational risk information, develop and test incident plans through tactical exercises (TX) for high-risk buildings.
- Support national and local RTC and Water Safety campaigns and tactics using risk-based data and working partnerships.
- Annual station based and LRF multi-agency TX programme.





MEDIUM

 Maintain local risk information based on historic incidents within the station area and undertake familiarisation visits training and exercising to ensure operational competence.

• Develop wildfire incident plans and work with partners to reduce the risk.



• Maintain awareness of Animal rescue capabilities at Bishop Auckland station & RSPCA

For all service risks at CDDFRS, firefighters will provide effective emergency responsae by maintaining skills and competence through the relevant training.
