HOW WE REDUCE STATION RISKS

VERY HIGH

- Target and deliver quality Home Fire Safety Checks to the most vulnerable in the community, focussing on making referrals to partners.
- Develop & apply a consistent menu of tactics with partners to reduce deliberate car fires.
- Promote and develop FireStoppers internally, and within the community.
- Conduct joint fire investigations with Police to identify trends & prosecute offenders.

HIGH

- Complete business fire safety audits, familiarisation visits and where appropriate pursue enforcement. (Conducted by FS team)
- Gather new & reinspect existing operational risk information, develop and test incident plans through tactical exercises (TX) for highrisk buildings.
- Support national and local RTC and Water Safety campaigns and tactics using risk-based data and working partnerships.
- Annual station based and LRF multi-agency TX programme.
- Develop & apply a consistent menu of tactics with partners to reduce deliberate secondary (nuisance) fires.

MEDIUM

- Gather new & reinspect existing operational risk information, develop and test incident plans through tactical exercises (TX) for high-risk buildings.
- Annual station based and LRF multi-agency TX programme.

LOW

- Develop wildfire incident plans and work with partners to reduce the risk.
- Maintain local risk information based on historic incidents within the station area and undertake familiarisation visits training and exercising to ensure operational competence.
- Maintain awareness of Animal rescue capabilities at Bishop Auckland station & RSPCA
