HOW WE REDUCE STATION RISKS

VERY HIGH

- Develop & apply a consistent menu of tactics with partners to reduce deliberate car fires and secondary (nuisance) fires.
- Promote and develop FireStoppers internally, and within the community.
- Conduct joint fire investigations with Police to identify trends & prosecute offenders.

HIGH

- Target and deliver quality Home Fire Safety Checks to the most vulnerable in the community, focussing on making referrals to partners.
- Complete business fire safety audits, familiarisation visits and where appropriate pursue enforcement. (Conducted by FS team)
- Gather new & reinspect existing operational risk information, develop and test incident plans through tactical exercises (TX) for high-risk buildings.
- Annual station based and LRF multi-agency TX programme.
- Support national and local RTC Safety campaigns and tactics using risk-based data and working partnerships.

MEDIUM

- Maintain operational risk information relevant to railways to support the consistency of approach to this incident type and undertake familiarisation visits training and exercising to ensure operational competence.
- L3 Rope rescue capability

LOW

- Maintain local risk information based on historic incidents within the station area and undertake familiarisation visits training and exercising to ensure operational competence.
- Maintain awareness of Animal rescue capabilities at Bishop Auckland station & RSPCA.
- Maintain MTA capability and apply Joint Emergency Services Interoperability Programme (JESIP) and develop role of NILO

For all service risks at CDDFRS, firefighters will provide effective emergency response by maintaining skills and competence through the relevant training.
